Dear Mr. Allen:

Pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation - East, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307, your submittal filed in the above referenced docket is accepted for filing, effective January 13, 2010, as requested.

On February 12, 2010, New York Independent System Operator, Inc. (NYISO) filed Second Revised Sheet No. 91B and Original Sheet No. 91C to its FERC Electric Tariff, Original Volume No. 2 in compliance with the Commission's January 7, 2010 Order.¹ The January 7 Order accepted a filing made by the NYISO on November 6, 2009, but directed the NYISO to submit revisions to clarify the rules for posting of Day-Ahead Reliability Unit (DARU) commitments to the NYISO website. The proposed revisions comply with the Commission's directive.

Notice of the filing was published in the Federal Register with comments, protests and interventions due on or before March 5, 2010. No interventions, comments or protests were filed.
