Reference: Small Generator Interconnection Agreement – Service Agreement No. 2544

On September 16, 2020, New York Independent System Operator, Inc. (NYISO) and Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid (National Grid) jointly filed an executed Small Generator Interconnection Agreement (SGIA) between NYISO, National Grid, and Pattersonville Solar Facility, LLC, designated as Service Agreement No. 2544 under NYISO's Open Access Transmission Tariff (OATT).¹ Applicants state that the SGIA provides for the interconnection of the solar electricity generating facility to certain facilities of National Grid that are part of the New York State Transmission System and that the SGIA contains language that does not conform to the language in the *pro forma* SGIA contained in Attachment Z of the NYISO OATT.

Pursuant to the authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation – East, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307, your submittal is accepted for filing, effective September 3, 2020, as requested.

The filing was noticed on September 16, 2020, with comments, interventions, and protests due on or before October 7, 2020. Pursuant to Rule 214 (18 C.F.R. § 385.214 (2020)), to the extent that any timely filed motions to intervene and any motion to intervene out-of-time were filed before the issuance date of this order, such interventions

are granted. Granting late interventions at this stage of the proceeding will not disrupt the proceeding or place additional burdens on existing parties.

This acceptance for filing shall not be construed as constituting approval of the referenced filing or of any rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, or practice affecting such rate or service contained in your filing; nor shall such acceptance be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation associated therewith; and such acceptance is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against the applicants.

This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
