Pursuant to Section 2.13 of its Open Access Transmission Tariff ("OATT"), the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. ("NYISO") hereby notifies the Commission that an "Emergency State" existed in the New York Control Area on February 10, 2021 at 0119. As a result, the NYISO was required to take special action to ensure that the reliability of the New York State Transmission System was not adversely affected. The NYISO has enclosed documentation describing the Emergency State and its actions. As required by Section 2.13 of the OATT, the NYISO has also notified the New York State Public Service Commission of the Emergency State and its actions.

At 0119 on 02/10/2021	a Major Emergency was declared by the NYISO Shift Supervisor
	when the power flow on Central East VC exceeded its Voltage Transfer Limit by 5% or more
This was caused by:	Trip of the New Scotland 345KV 77K Bus at 0118
To correct this the NYISO Shift	
Supervisor:	Started and redispatched generation, placed capacitors in service, and moved PARs

Load relief was not required.

The Major Emergency was terminated at 0129 on 02/10/2021
