**Re: *New York Independent System Operator, Inc.*; Notice of Delayed  
Effective Date, Docket No. ER21-625-00\_**

Dear Secretary Bose:

In accordance with the requirements of the January 28, 2021 order issued by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“Commission”) in this proceeding (“January 28 Order”),<sup>1</sup> on May 25, 2021, the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. (“NYISO”) submitted a notice to specify the intended effective date for the proposed revisions to its Market Administration and Control Area Services Tariff (“Services Tariff”) that were accepted by the January 28 Order (“May 25 Notice”).<sup>2</sup>

The May 25 Notice indicated that the NYISO anticipated implementing the enhancements accepted by the January 28 Order on June 8, 2021. The NYISO hereby provides notice that it plans to delay the implementation of the changes until the June 10, 2021 market day.

### **I. Documents Submitted**

The NYISO respectfully submits the following with this filing letter:

1. A clean version of the revisions to the Services Tariff accepted by the January 28 Order reflecting an updated effective date of June 10, 2021 (“Attachment I”).

### **II. Notice of Delay of Effective Date**

The May 25 Notice indicated that if the NYISO subsequently determined that it would be unable to implement the changes accepted by the January 28 Order on June 8, 2021, the NYISO would provide a follow-up notice to the Commission.<sup>3</sup> Based on considerations of: (i) the

forecasted hot weather conditions currently expected to persist through a portion of this week; and (ii) aligning the implementation of the reserve procurement enhancements on the same market day in the Day-Ahead Market and Real-Time Market, the NYISO will delay the implementation of the changes accepted by the January 28 Order until the June 10, 2021 market day.<sup>4</sup>

### III. Service

The NYISO will send an electronic link to this filing to the official representative of each party to this proceeding, the official representative of each of its customers, each participant on its stakeholder committees, the New York State Public Service Commission, and the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities. In addition, the NYISO will post this filing on its website at [www.nyiso.com](http://www.nyiso.com).

### IV. Conclusion

The NYISO respectfully requests that the Commission accept this filing.
