Docket No. ER25-2680-000

Dear Secretary Reese:

On June 27, 2025, the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. (“NYISO”) submitted, in the above-captioned docket, its compliance filing and request for waivers of certain North American Energy Standards Board (“NAESB”) Wholesale Electric Quadrant (“WEQ”) business practice standards as set forth in Commission Order No. 676-K (“NAESB Filing”). After submitting its NAESB Filing, the NYISO became aware of errors in its filing letter and proposed tariff revisions. The NYISO respectfully submits this errata to correct those errors.

I. Errata

The NYISO proposes the following revisions to the initially submitted Open Access Transmission Tariff (“OATT”) and Market Administration and Control Area Services Tariff (“Services Tariff”) sections:

- Both Services Tariff Section 5.1.2 and OATT Section 2.17 are updated to correctly reflect the names for the applicable WEQ standards as set forth in FERC Order No. 676-K.

Further, the NYISO’s initially submitted OATT and Services Tariff revisions correctly reflect NYISO’s intention to continue its existing waiver from WEQ-001-13.1.3(c); however, the accompanying filing letter did not specifically address the waiver request for that standard. To that end, the NYISO requests continued waiver of WEQ-001-13.1.3(c) as previously granted by the Commission.¹ WEQ-001-13.1.3(c) would require NYISO to provide links to Redispatch Costs information required by 18 C.F.R. section 37.6(j)(2). The Commission has granted NYISO a waiver of 18 C.F.R. section 37.6(j)(2) because the NYISO continuously redispatches the transmission system to meet load and support requests for firm transmission service using its

bid-based, security-constrained economic dispatch/redispach process and does not offer the more limited redispach services found in the *pro forma* OATT.

The NYISO's filing letter stated that the NYISO is seeking continued waiver from WEQ Standard 001-13.1.2. However, this request is not necessary since that standard is currently Reserved (*i.e.*, blank).

The NYISO's filing letter stated that the NYISO is seeking continued waiver from WEQ-001-18 and WEQ-001-19. However, this request is not necessary since those two standards are currently Reserved (*i.e.*, blank).

The NYISO's filing letter stated that the NYISO is seeking a continued waiver of WEQ Standards 001-23 through 001-23.9. However, the filing letter should have instead referenced WEQ Standard 001-23 in its entirety.

Finally, the NYISO's filing letter included a waiver request for WEQ-001 Version 3.3 Standards 001-101 through 001-107.3. However, this waiver request for WEQ-001 Version 3.3 should have also included 001-107.3.1.

II. Documents Submitted with this Filing Letter

1. An updated blacklined version of the NYISO's proposed revisions to Section 2.17 of its OATT and Section 5.1.2 of its Services Tariff incorporating by reference the cybersecurity standards in WEQ Version 004 (Attachment I);
2. An updated clean version of the NYISO's proposed revisions to Section 2.17 of its OATT and Section 5.1.2 of its Services Tariff incorporating by reference the cybersecurity standards in WEQ Version 004 (Attachment II);
3. An updated blacklined version of the NYISO's proposed revisions to Section 2.17 of its OATT and Section 5.1.2 of its Services Tariff incorporating by reference and reflecting anticipated waivers from all WEQ Version 004 standards (Attachment III); and
4. An updated clean version of the NYISO's proposed revisions to Section 2.17 of its OATT and Section 5.1.2 of its Services Tariff incorporating by reference and reflecting anticipated waivers from all WEQ Version 004 standards (Attachment IV).

III. Service

The NYISO will send an electronic copy of this errata to the NAESB Filing to the official representative of each party to this proceeding, to the New York Public Service Commission, and to the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities. In addition, a complete copy of this filing will be posted on the NYISO's website at www.nyiso.com, and the NYISO will send an electronic link to this filing to the official representative of each of its customers and to each participant on its stakeholder committees.

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IV. Conclusion

The NYISO respectfully requests that the Commission accept for filing the proposed Services Tariff and OATT corrections that are attached hereto, with effective dates of February 27, 2026, and August 27, 2026.
