**Re: *New York Independent System Operator, Inc.*, Compliance Filing to Conform
Tariff Records; Docket No. ER26--000**

Dear Secretary Reese,

On July 20, 2026, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“Commission”) accepted tariff revisions to the New York Independent System Operator (“NYISO”)’s Open Access Transmission Tariff (“OATT”) and Market Administration and Control Area Services Tariff (“Services Tariff”) regarding NYISO’s deliverability test methodology.

Consistent with the Commission’s eTariff requirements, the NYISO submits this filing using eTariff Filing Code 85 to incorporate the tariff revisions accepted by the Commission into the version of Section 5.12 of the Services Tariff that are effective as of July 21, 2026, to account for changes to the underlying tariff section since the NYISO’s initial filing of the tariff revisions in these proceedings.

I. Background

On May 19, 2026, the NYISO submitted to the Commission in Docket No. ER26-2577-000 proposed revisions to its OATT and Services Tariff to revise the manner in which deliverability is evaluated in the NYISO interconnection studies to appropriately identify deliverability upgrades in the current environment of large Cluster Studies (“Deliverability Methodology Revisions”).¹ As part of the revisions, the NYISO proposed a revision to Section 5.12 of the Services Tariff. The Commission accepted these tariff revisions, which became effective on July 21, 2026.²

In a separate docket, on February 18, 2026, as amended on April 28, 2026, the NYISO submitted revisions to Section 5.12 of its Services Tariff to modify its Installed Capacity market rules to better reflect the potential for seasonal reliability risk and to account for seasonal

availability of capacity supply (“Winter Reliability Capacity Enhancements”).³ On April 10, 2026, the Commission issued a letter requesting additional information regarding certain aspects of the NYISO’s Winter Reliability Capacity Enhancements (“Deficiency Letter”).⁴ On April 28, 2026, the NYISO filed a response to the Deficiency Letter.⁵ On June 26, 2026, the Commission issued an order accepting the NYISO’s Winter Reliability Capacity Enhancements filing, effective June 28, 2026.⁶

The NYISO’s Deliverability Methodology Revisions proposed in Docket No. ER26-2577-000 were submitted prior to the Commission’s order accepting the Winter Reliability Capacity Enhancements. The revisions to Section 5.12 of the Services Tariff in the Deliverability Methodology Revisions filing, submitted on May 19, 2026, did not account for subsequent updates to the underlying tariff language in Section 5.12 of the Services Tariff subsequently accepted by the Commission in the Winter Reliability Capacity Enhancements docket on June 26, 2026. Accordingly, the NYISO submits herewith, using eTariff Filing Code 85, an updated Section 5.12 of the Services Tariff to incorporate the tariff revisions accepted in the Winter Reliability Capacity Enhancements docket, effective June 28, 2026, into the version of Section 5.12 of the Services Tariff that are effective as of July 21, 2026, to account for changes to the underlying tariff sections since the NYISO’s initial filing of the Deliverability Methodology Revisions in Docket No. ER26-2577-000.

The eTariff record attached to this submission contains a clean version of the revised Section 5.12 of the Services Tariff that incorporates the changes that the Commission accepted in Docket No. ER26-1431 that became effective on June 28, 2026.

This filing is submitted to conform the Commission’s official electronic Tariff records to the Tariff revisions that the Commission has accepted for filing. Accepting this filing will improve the accuracy of the Commission’s eTariff record. Because the changes identified in this filing from the Deliverability Methodology Revisions filing docket were accepted by the Commission with an effective date subsequent to the effective date of the Winter Reliability Capacity Enhancements, it is appropriate for the NYISO to submit this filing to incorporate both accepted tariff revisions into the Commission’s eTariff record.
