Re: *New York Independent System Operator, Inc.*, Docket No. ER15-485-000; Compliance Filing Establishing an Effective Date for the Revised Transmission Shortage Costs

Dear Secretary Bose:

In accordance with the requirements of the Commission's January 15, 2015 order in this proceeding,¹ the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. ("NYISO") submits this filing to provide notice of the expected effective date for the proposed tariff amendments concerning its revised Transmission Shortage Cost (*i.e.* a graduated transmission demand curve).²

The NYISO's graduated transmission demand curve establishes a series of Transmission Shortage Costs that are dependent on the amount of transmission shortage. The Transmission Shortage Cost/Amount of transmission shortage pairs are provided in the table below:

Transmission Shortage Cost	Amount of transmission shortage
\$350	When the transmission shortage is >0 but ≤5 MW
\$1,175	When the transmission shortage is >5 but ≤20 MW
\$4,000	When the transmission shortage is >20 MW

² Capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the meaning specified in Section 2 of the NYISO Market Administration and Control Area Services Tariff ("Services Tariff") and Section 1 of the NYISO Open Access Transmission Tariff ("OATT").
