Notice of Cancellation of Service Agreement No. 1630 Engineering, Procurement and Construction Services

Agreement with Beacon Power Corporation

Dear Secretary Bose:

Pursuant to Section 35.15 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's ("Commission") regulations, Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid ("Niagara Mohawk") submits for Commission acceptance this Notice of Cancellation of the Engineering, Procurement and Construction Services Agreement ("EPC Agreement") between Niagara Mohawk and Beacon Power Corporation ("Beacon Power").

Niagara Mohawk respectfully requests that the Commission accept this Notice of Cancellation effective as of the day after this filing is submitted, *i.e.*, August 9, 2014.

I. Background and Justification for Cancellation

The EPC Agreement concerns design, engineering, procurement, construction, and project management and construction services provided by Niagara Mohawk to effectuate system upgrades necessary for Beacon Power's interconnection of a 20 megawatt flywheel generating facility to the New York State Electric and Gas Corporation's ("NYSEG") 115 kV system at Stephentown Station in Rensselaer County, New York via a single breaker tap to the 115 kV bus at the station. Niagara Mohawk's Greenbush-Stephentown 993 Line ties to the same 115 kV bus, thereby making Niagara Mohawk an affected system owner for the interconnection and making it necessary for Beacon Power and Niagara Mohawk to enter into the EPC Agreement in order to ensure the reliable interconnection of Beacon Power's generating facility to NYSEG's 115 kV system.

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Niagara Mohawk filed the EPC Agreement in Docket No. ER10-3165-000 as Original Service Agreement No. 1630 under the Open Access Transmission Tariff of the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. ("NYISO"). The Commission accepted the EPC Agreement for filing effective November 29, 2010.²

Section 2.1 of the EPC Agreement states that it will remain in effect until Niagara Mohawk receives final payment under the EPC Agreement. Niagara Mohawk has received that final payment.

II. Effective Date

Niagara Mohawk requests that the Commission accept this Notice of Cancellation of the EPC Agreement effective as of August 9, 2014. As noted above, Niagara Mohawk has received final payment under the EPC Agreement. Therefore, good cause exists to grant the requested effective date.³
