> Re: Docket No. ER23-1863-00_, New York Independent System Operator, Inc.; Notice of Delayed Effective Date

Dear Secretary Bose:

On May 11, 2023, the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. ("NYISO") filed proposed revisions to its Market Administration and Control Area Services Tariff ("Services Tariff") to implement enhancements to its transmission constraint pricing logic.¹ The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("Commission") issued an order on July 6, 2023 accepting the NYISO's proposal ("July 6 Order").²

The July 6 Order directed the NYISO to submit a subsequent filing to specify the effective date for the proposed enhancements.³ On September 26, 2023, the NYISO submitted a notice of its intent to establish an October 10, 2023 effective date for the tariff revisions accepted by the July 6 Order ("September 26 Notice").⁴ The NYISO submits this filing to inform the Commission of a need to delay the effective date for such tariff revisions.

I. Notice of Delayed Effective Date

In the September 26 Notice, the NYISO committed to inform the Commission if conditions arose that require a delay of the anticipated effective date.⁵ The NYISO submits this additional notice to inform the Commission that an October 10, 2023 effective date is no longer achievable.

During its ongoing comprehensive testing and validation of the enabling software, the NYISO identified an unanticipated issue. The NYISO is expeditiously working to resolve this

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matter but is not in a position, at this time, to definitively provide an updated effective date for the tariff revisions accepted by the July 6 Order.

A delay of at least two weeks will be required for the development of a resolution, followed by further testing and validation of the enabling software. As a result, the NYISO currently anticipates that the effective date for the tariff revisions will be delayed until at least October 24, 2023.

After a revised implementation plan has been finalized, the NYISO will provide an updated notice of the effective date for the applicable tariff revisions in accordance with the requirements of the July 6 Order.

II. Service

The NYISO will send an electronic copy of this filing to the official representative of each party to this proceeding, the New York State Public Service Commission, and the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities. The NYISO will also send an electronic link to this filing to the official representative of each of its customers, and each participant on its stakeholder committees. In addition, the NYISO will post a copy of this filing on its website at www.nyiso.com.

III. Conclusion

The NYISO respectfully requests that the Commission accept this filing.
